# CONTEXTUAL FIT

Contextual fit is the match between the strategies, procedures, or elements of an intervention and the values, needs, skills, and resources of those who implement and experience the intervention

ASPE Issue Brief

- What is the strength of the evidence?
- Does the model fit the needs of children and families in the local service area?
- Is the model fully operationalized? Is it replicable?
- Does the model fit with current efforts and initiatives in the service system?
- What resources are available to support implementation?
- Do organizations have what is required to fully and effectively implement these strategies?
- Are leaders engaged and committed?

***The dynamic interplay between characteristics of the service system, service delivery organization, and client calls for early and ongoing assessments of the multi-level characteristics to first determine if “good enough fit” exists between a potential EBP and local context and then to optimize that “fit” over time (Supplee and Metz, 2015)***

- Systems – funding, policy, regulatory environment
- Organization – leadership, culture, climate
- Provider – staff attitudes towards innovation and EBPs
- Clients – needs, culture, co-occurring diagnoses

- Developing hospitable systems environments including policies, partnerships, and funding streams

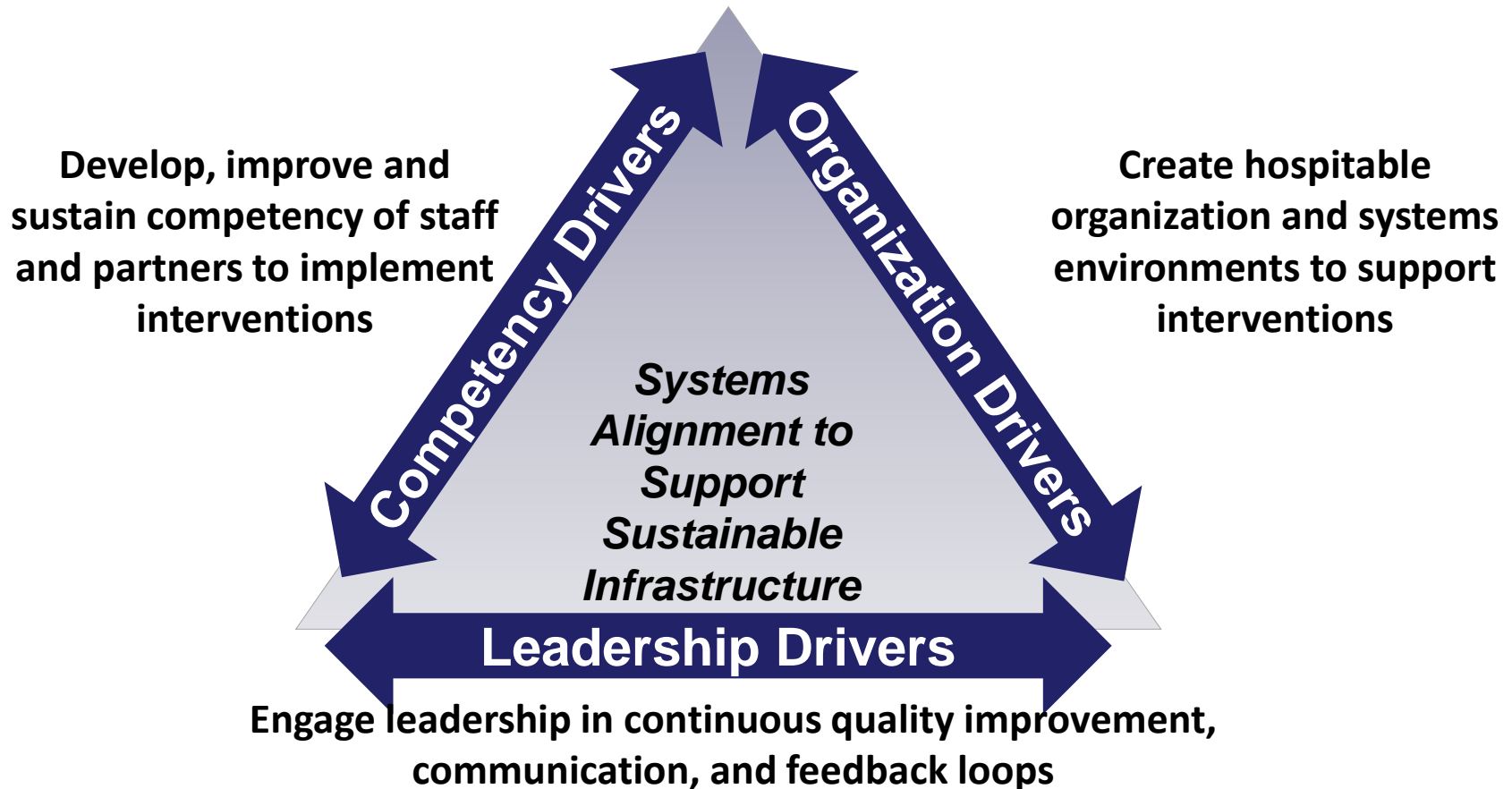

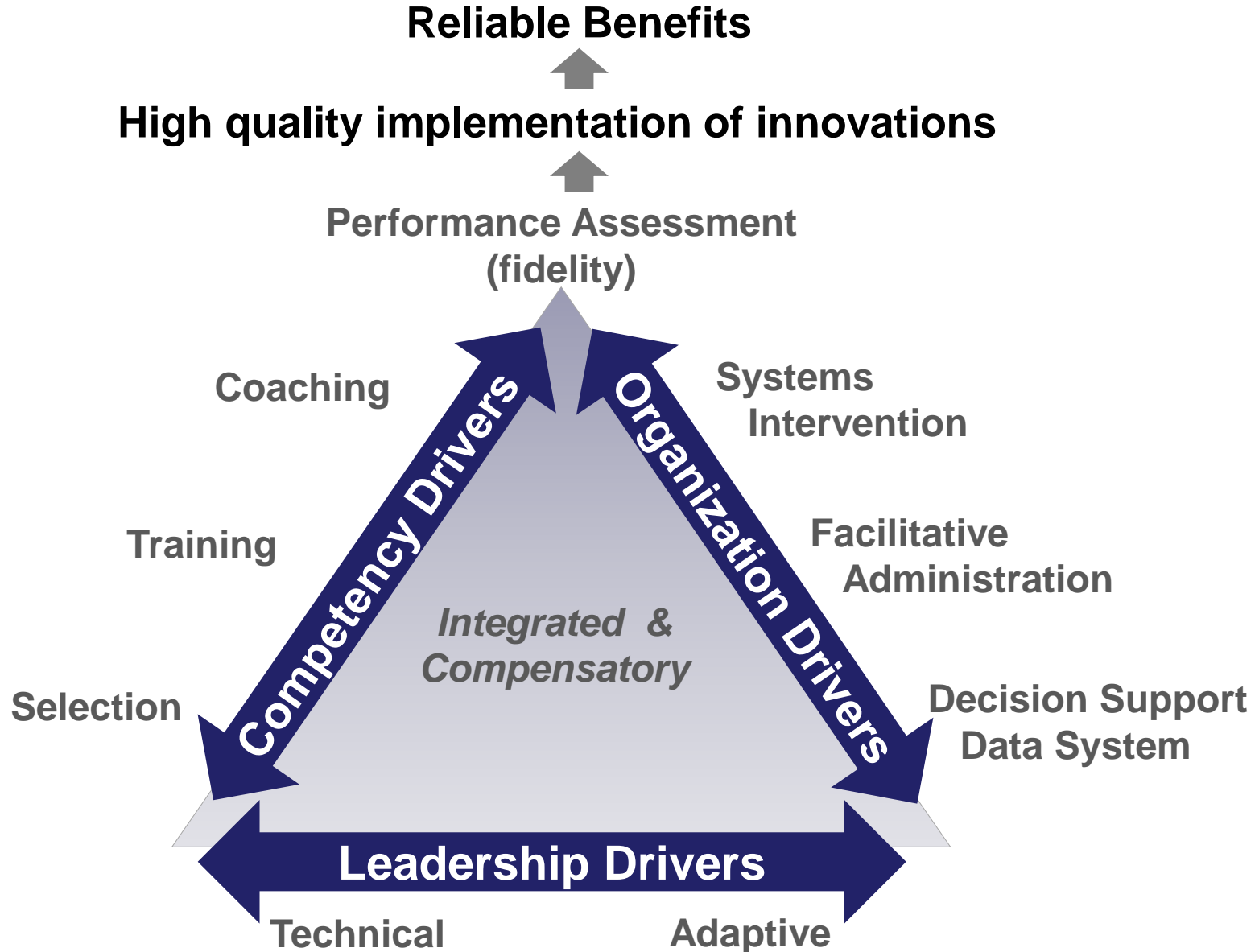

**High fidelity implementation of Mental Health Strategy**



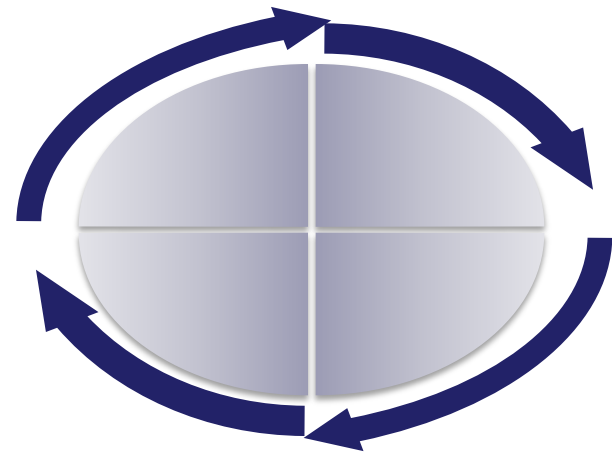

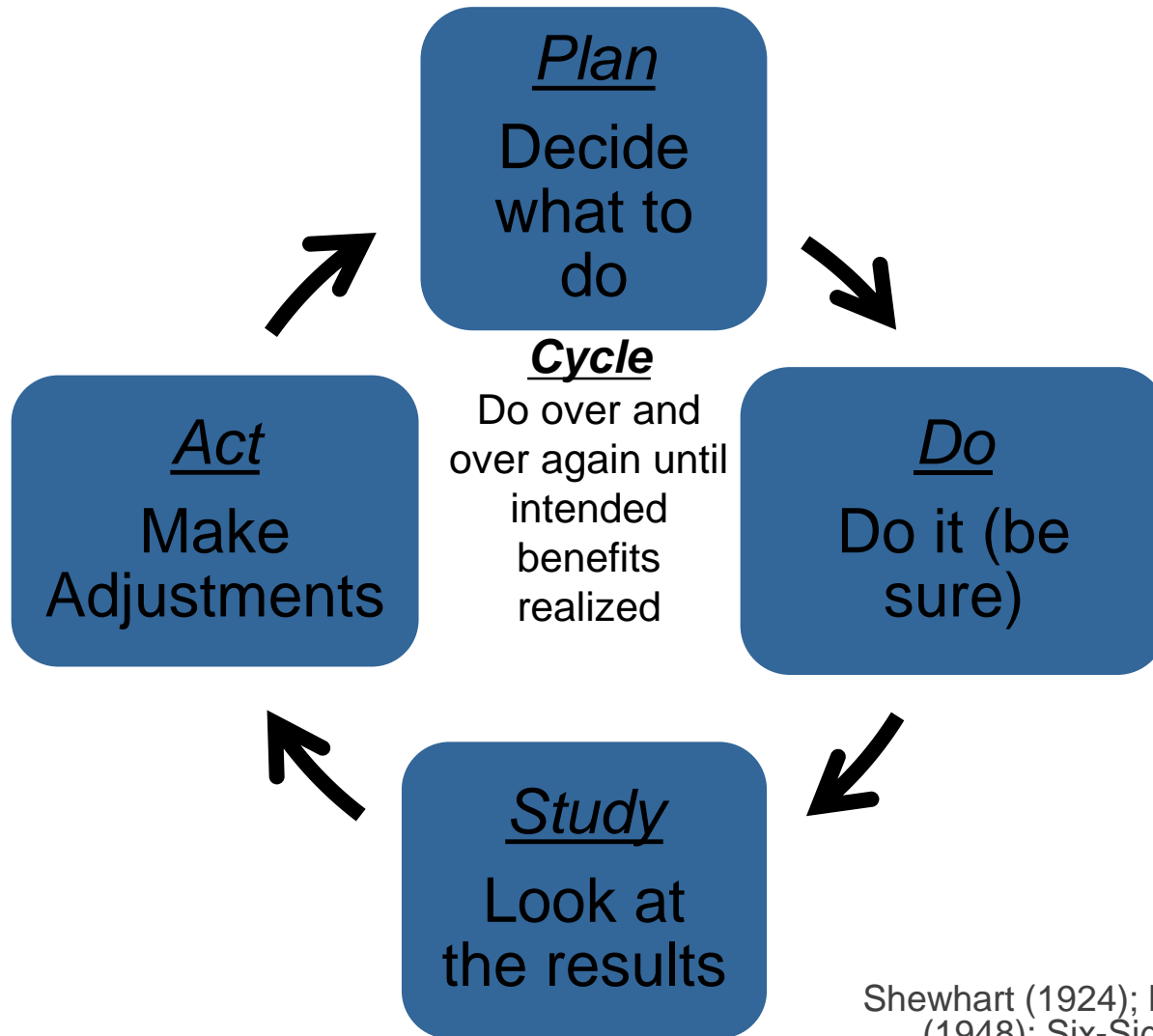


# Supporting Continuous Quality Improvement for Scale and Sustainability

Shewhart (1924); Deming & Juran (1948); Six-Sigma (1990)

Dynamic frameworks for sustainability and scale emphasize that change exists in the use of interventions over time, the characteristics of practice settings, and the broader system that establishes the context for how care is delivered.

***Evidence is grown in  
research settings.***

***Evidence is optimized in practice.***

Interventions can be continually improved, boosting sustainment in practice, and can enable ongoing learning among developers, interventionists, researchers and patients

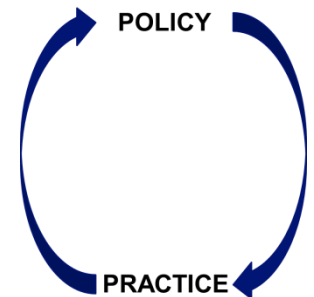


# Active Implementation

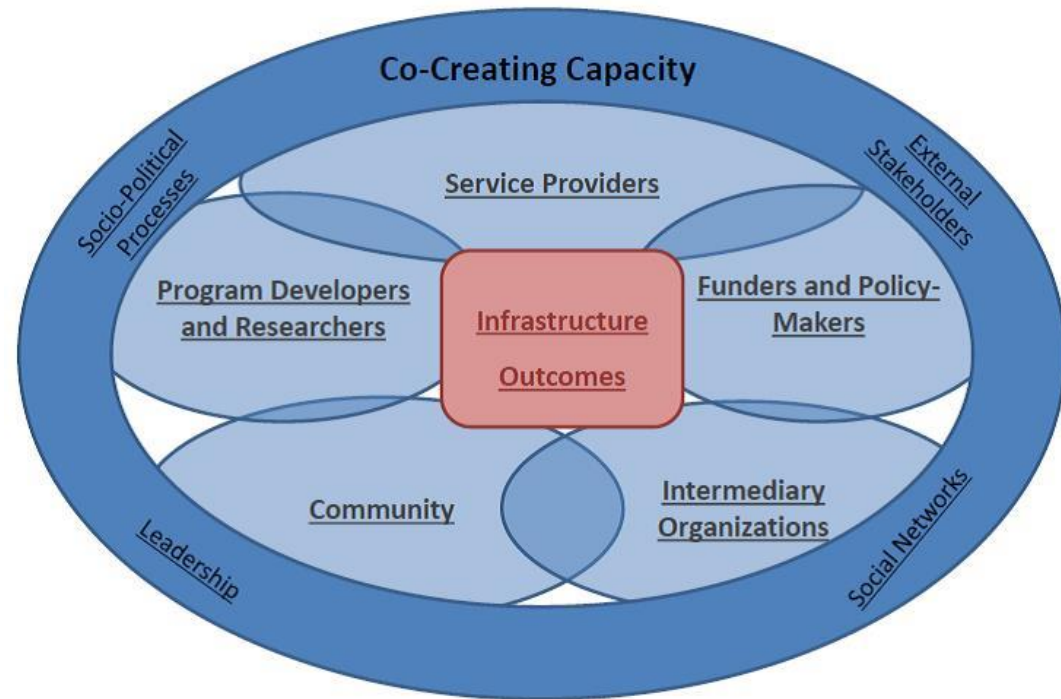

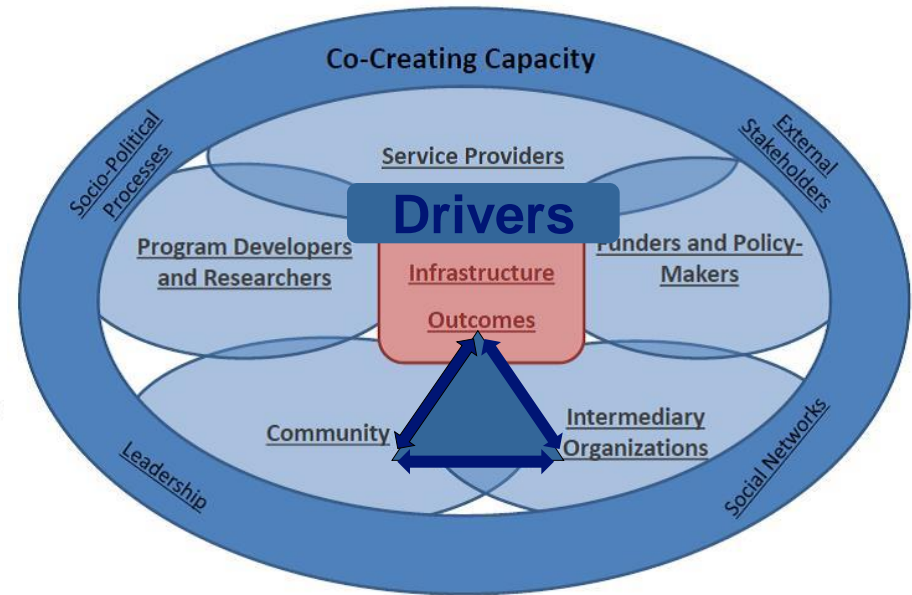


# Co-Creating Capacity

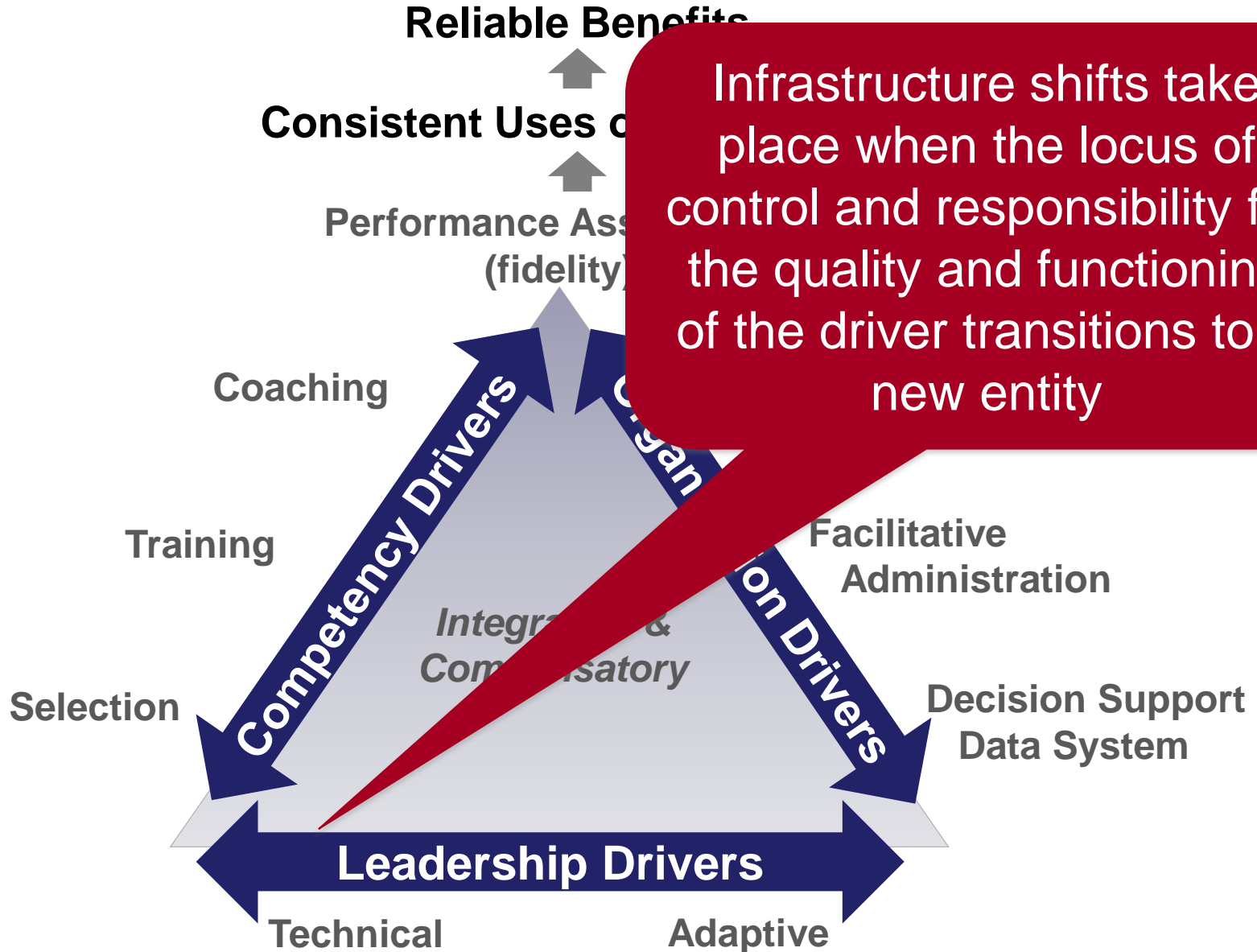
*Co-Creative capacity refers to deeply involving a range of key stakeholders across scientific, governance, and local practice boundaries to create the infrastructure and context that enables and sustains the use of evidence in practice. (Metz, 2014).*

# When do these shifts happen?

- Program developer or purveyor supports diminish
  - Coaching, fidelity assessments transition to local jurisdiction
- Research and evaluation funding ends
  - Decision-support data systems are no longer funded
- “Special” accommodations end
  - Planning periods end; integration of new services into overall service system takes place
- Scaling Up is a focus
  - The goal is to develop more proximate implementation capacity that is effective, efficient, and integrated; regional or local capacity developed
